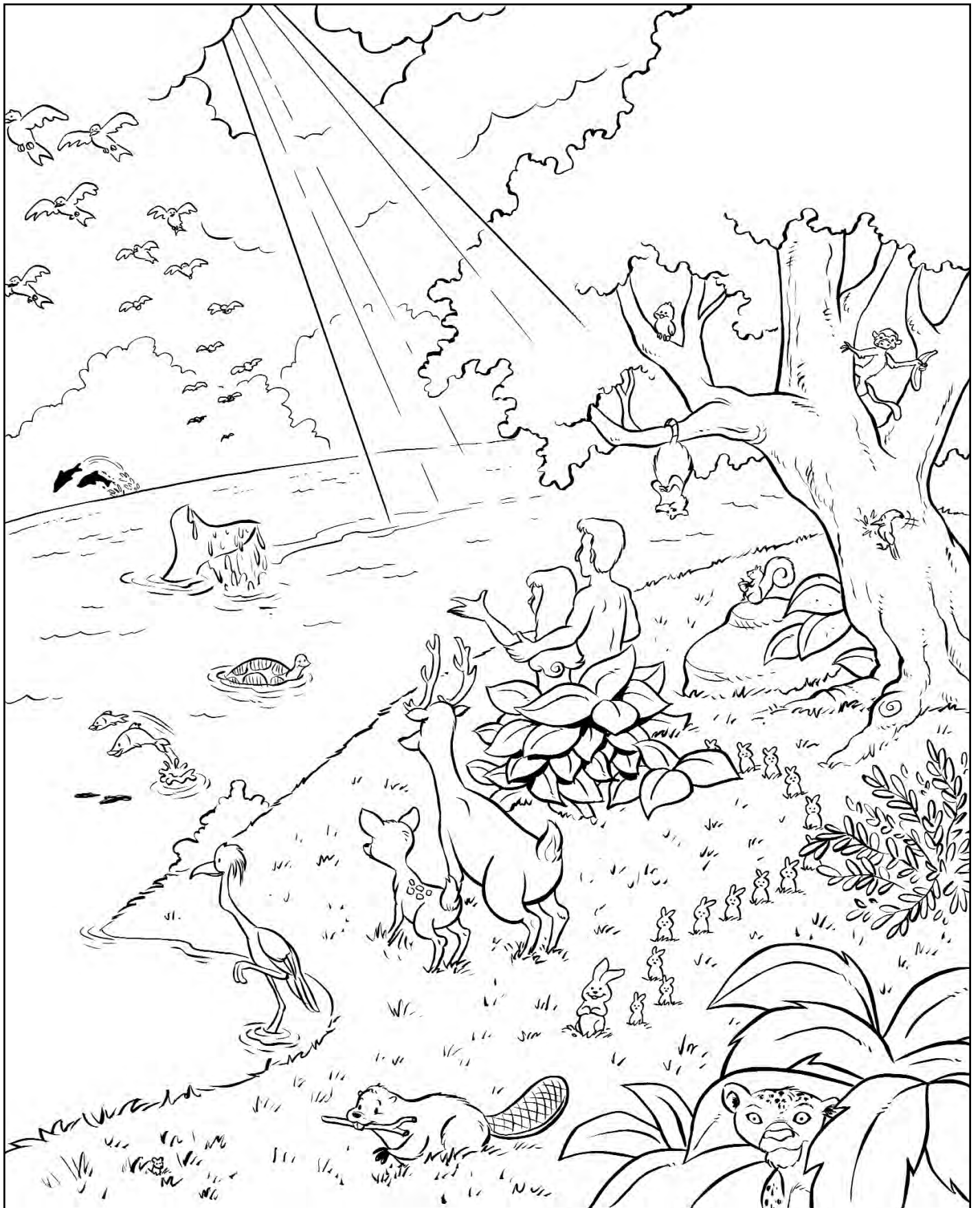
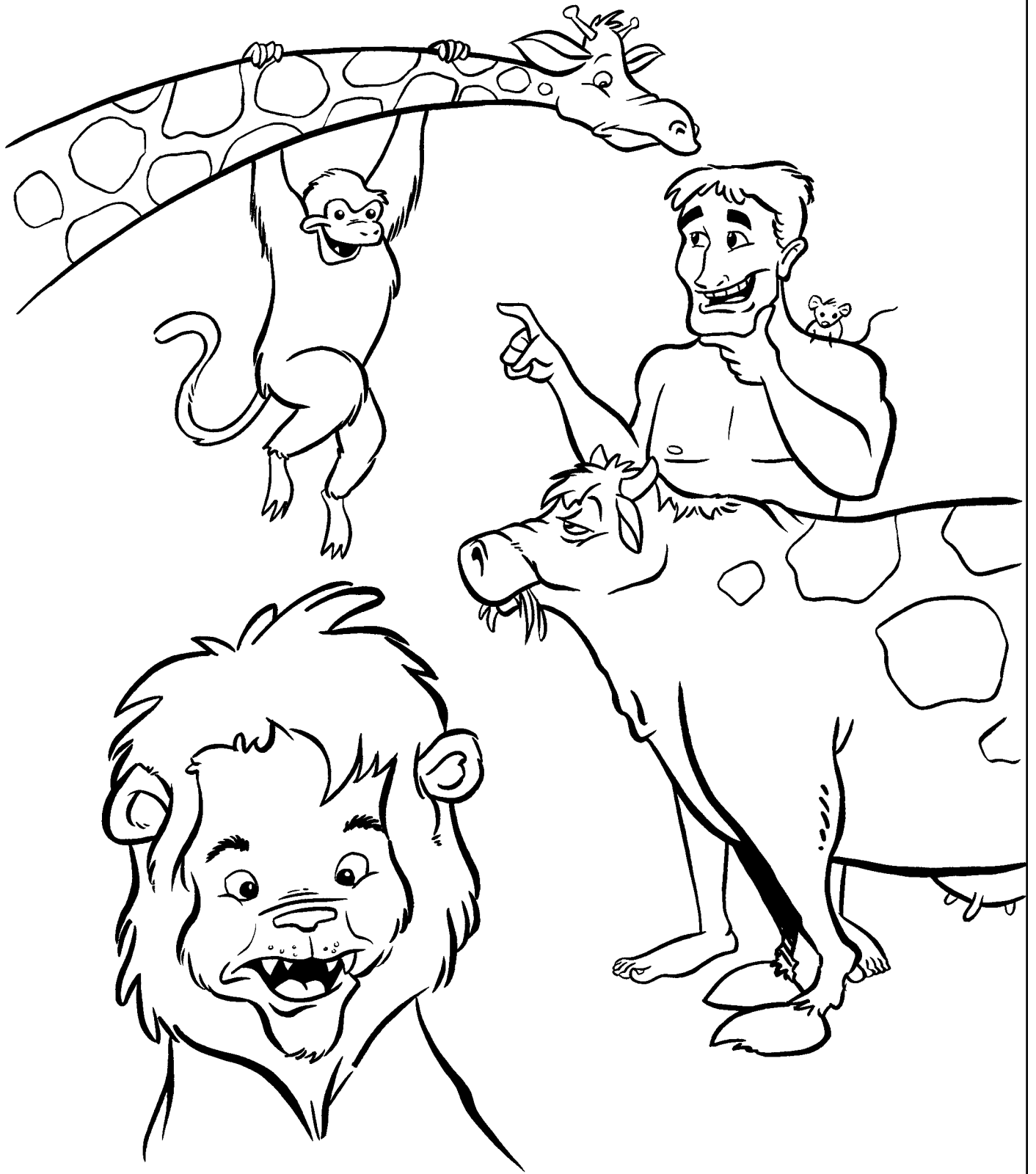


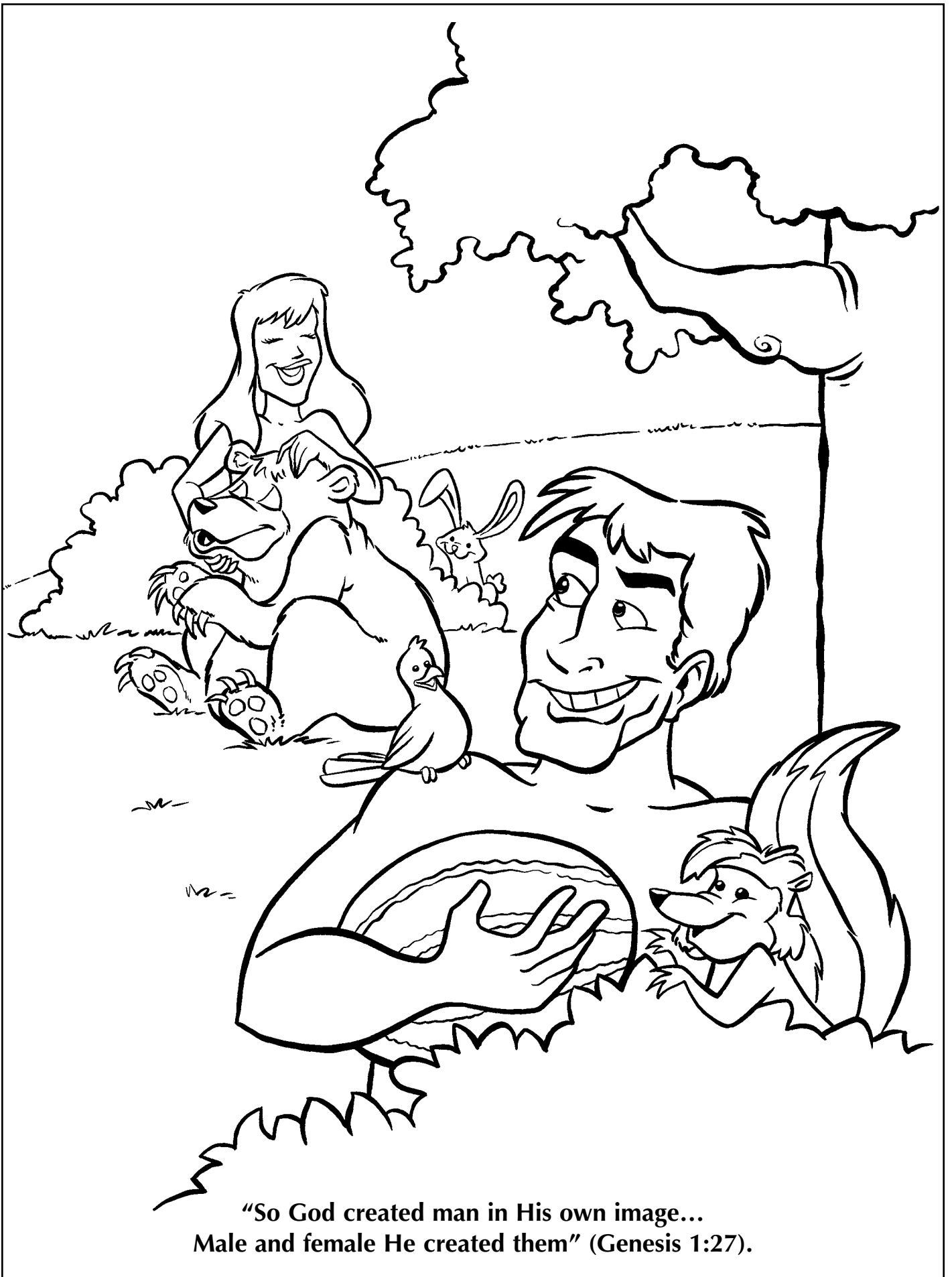
God made the heavens and the earth in six days.

Male and female He created them” (Genesis 1:27).**



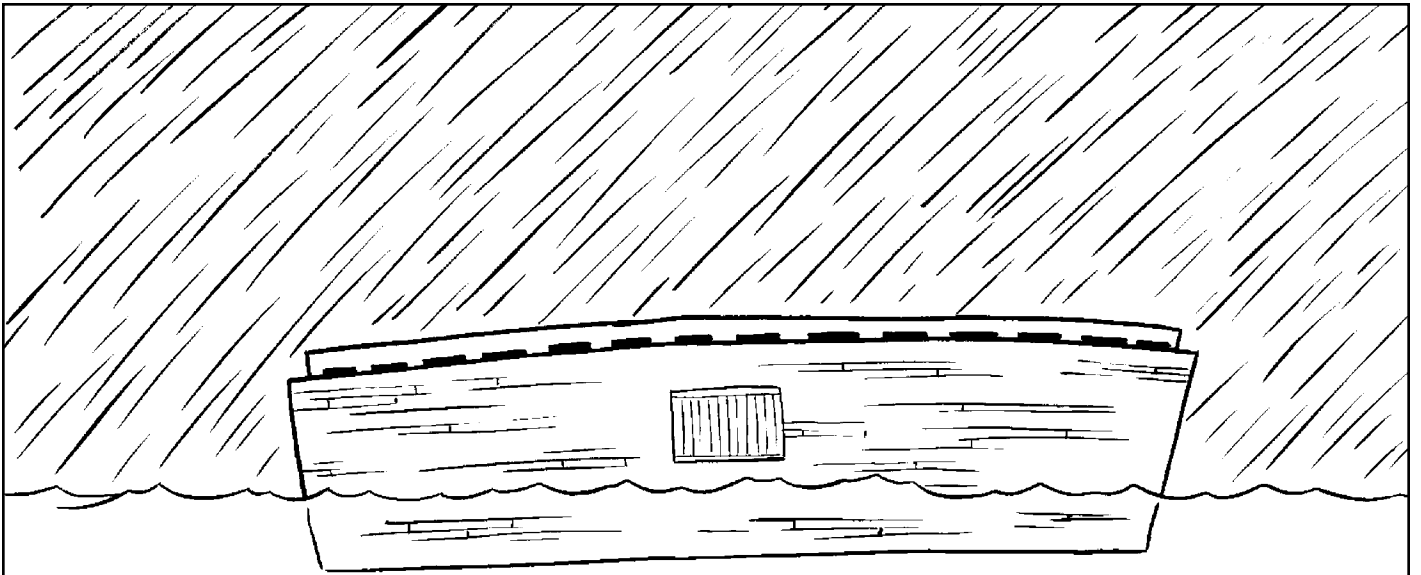
**The serpent tempted Eve, saying, "Has God indeed said, 'You shall not eat of every tree of the garden?'" (Genesis 3:1).**

**After 40 days, Noah sent out a dove from the ark to see whether the waters had receded from the earth (Gen. 8:6-12).**



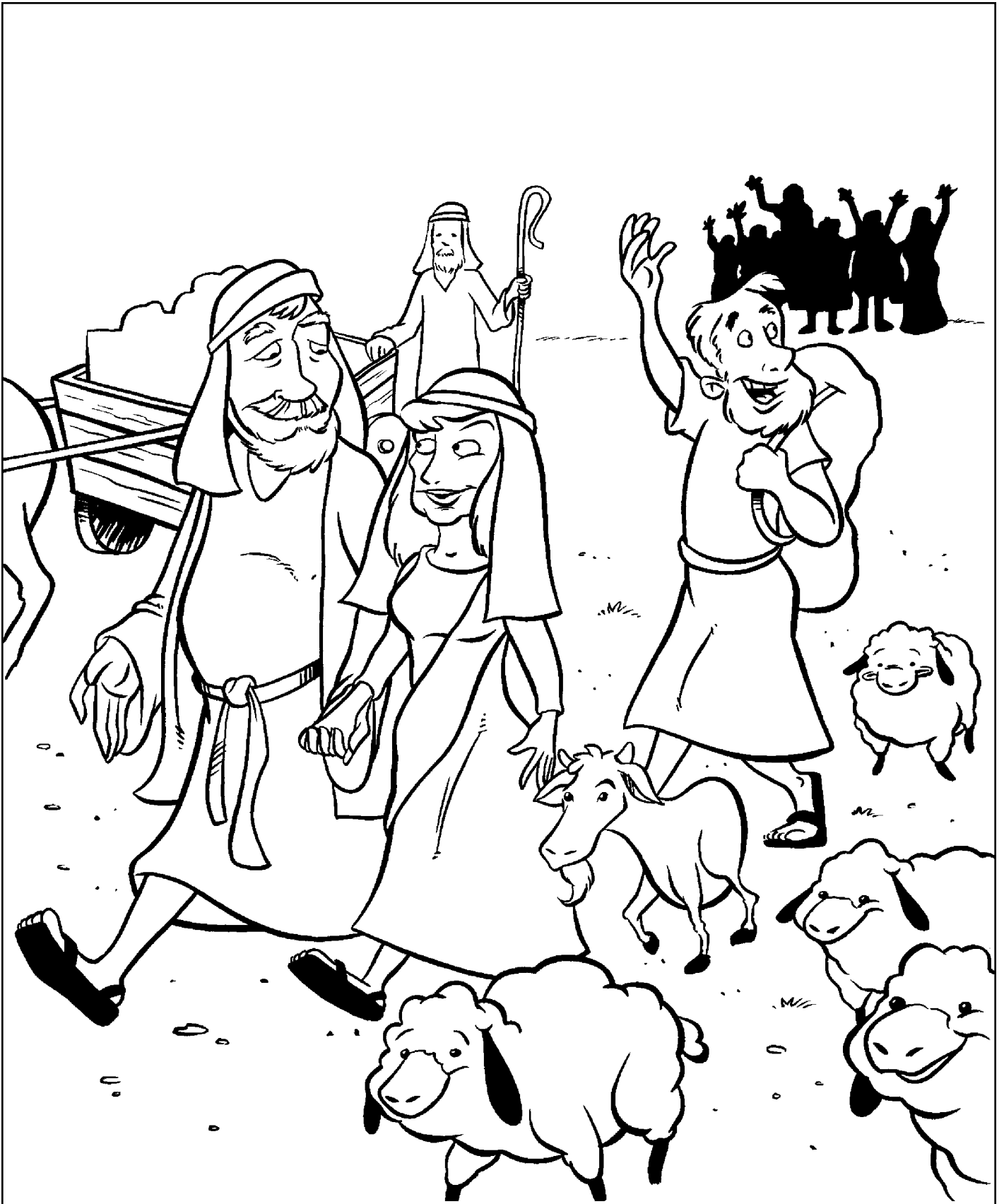
God set the rainbow in the cloud as a sign of His promise to never flood the earth again (Gen. 9:12-17).

**Abram built an altar to the Lord in the land God had given him (Gen. 12:7).**

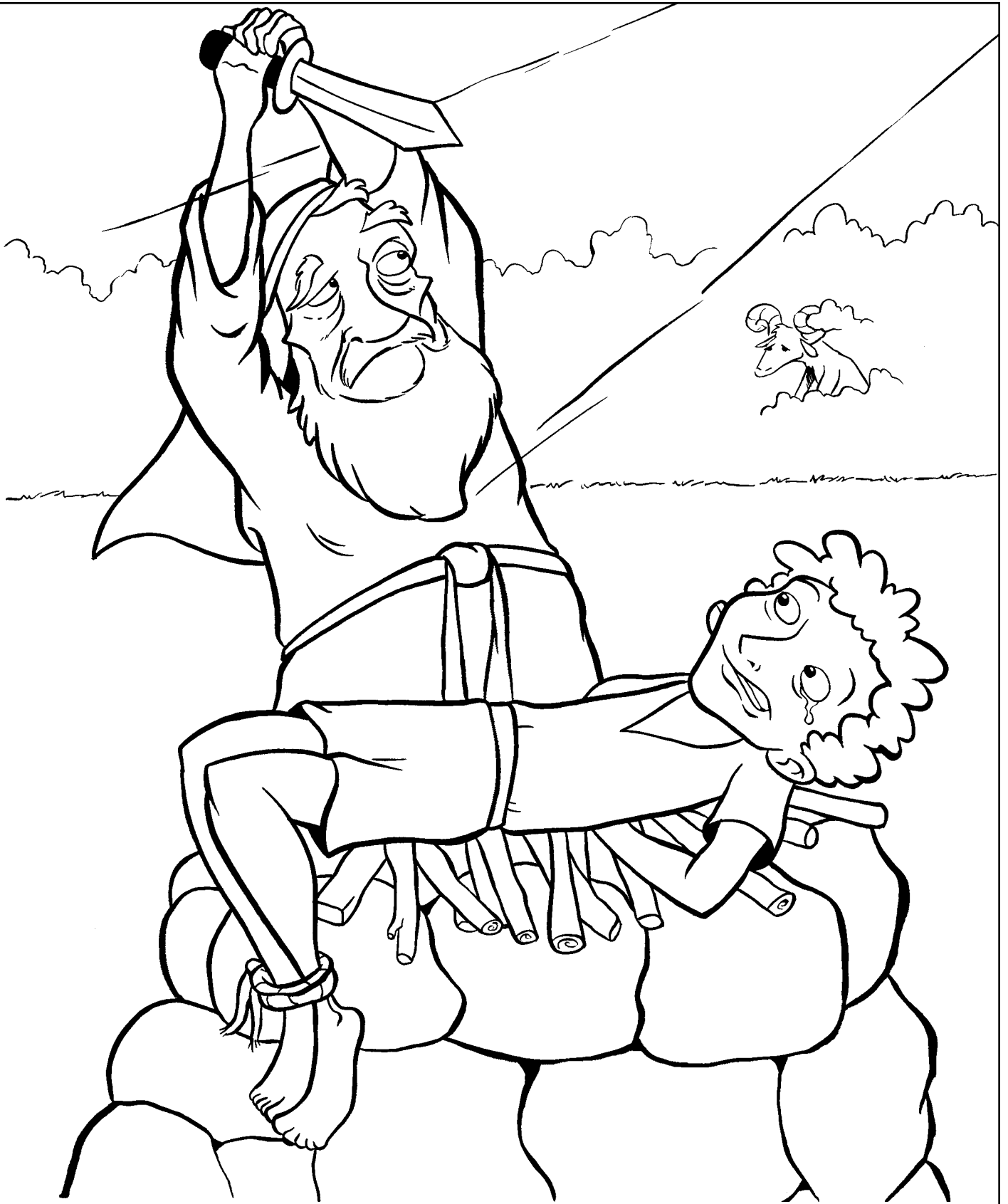


**God gave Abraham and Sarah a baby in their old age.
