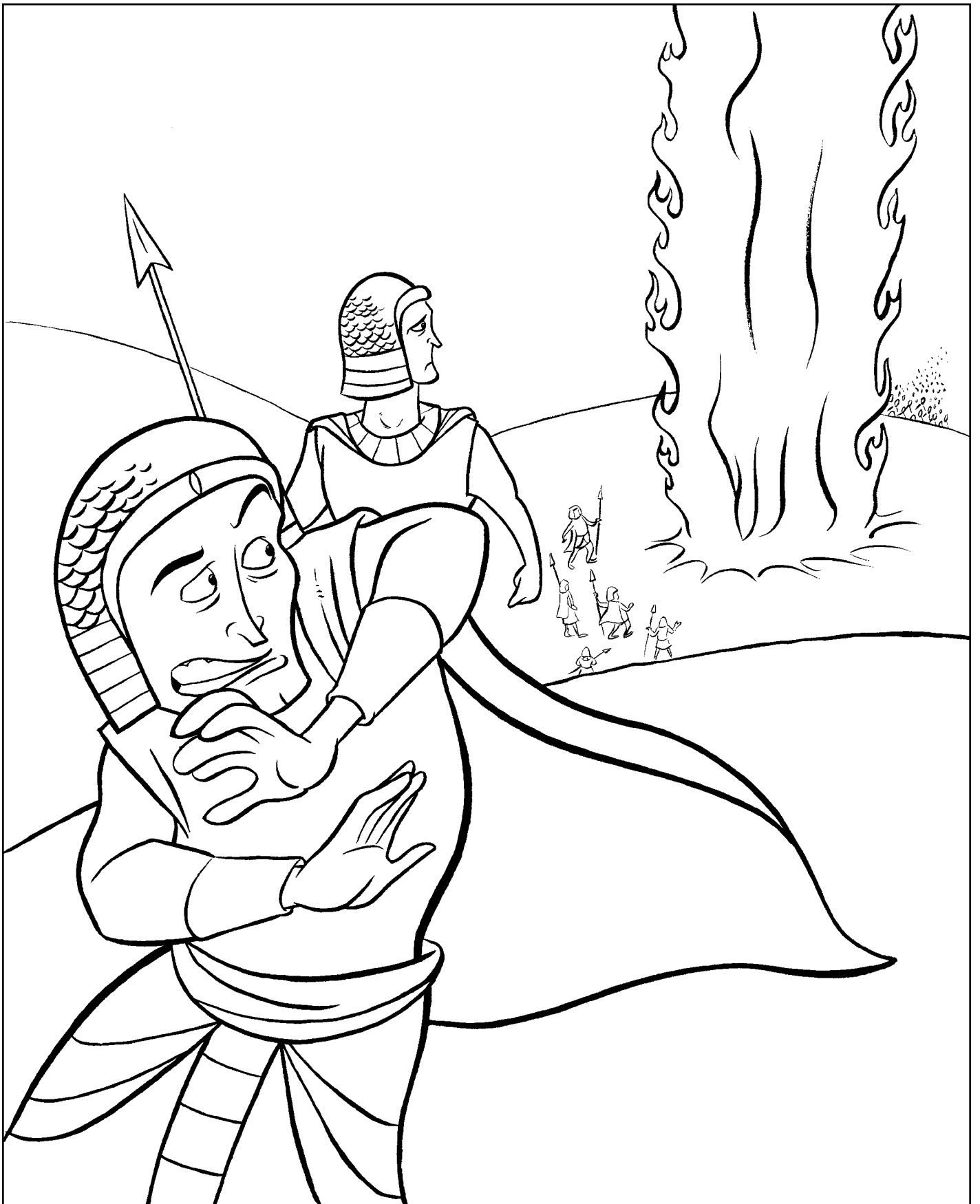
"And they shall take some of the blood and put it on the two doorposts and on the lintel of the houses where they eat it" (Exodus 12:7).

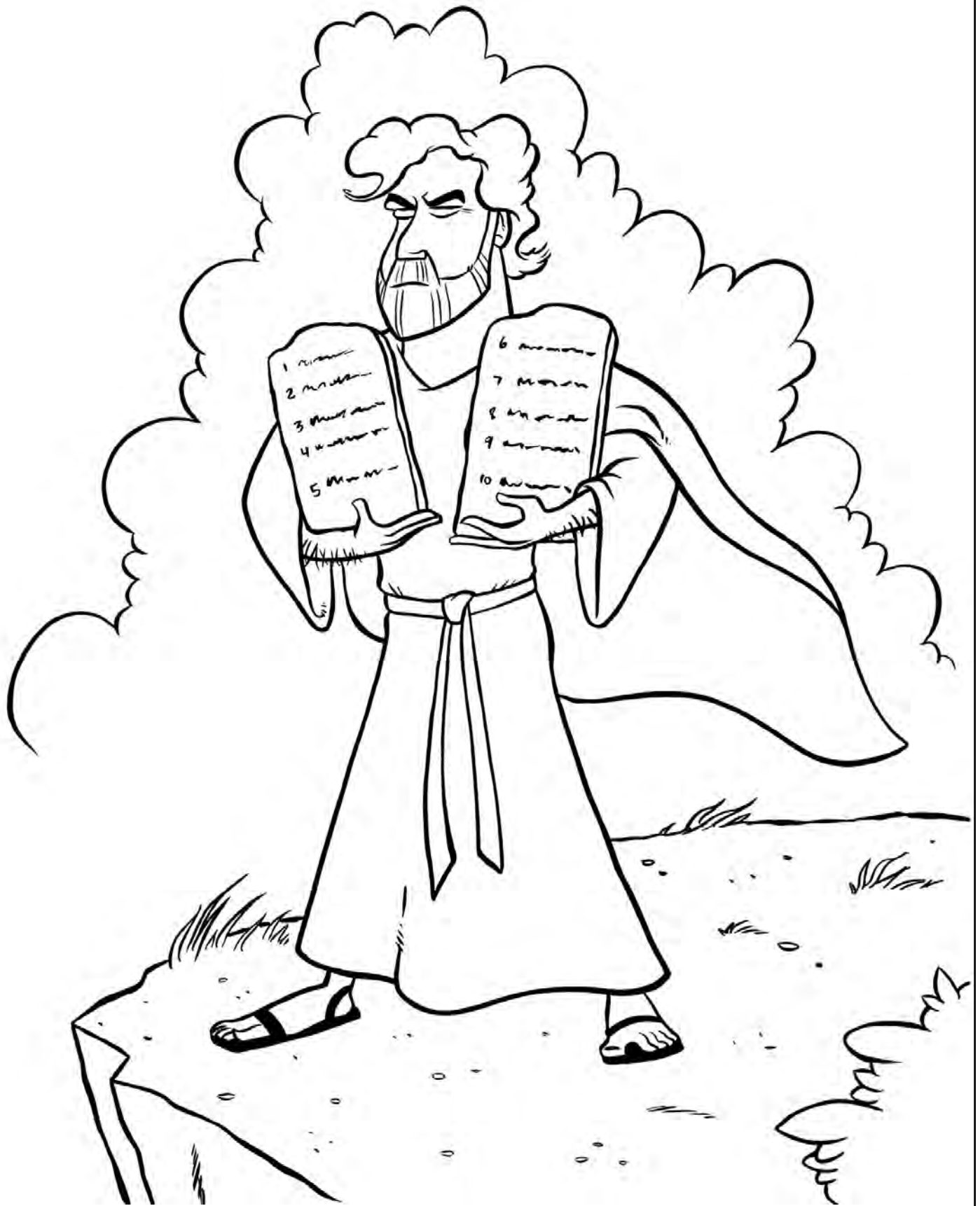

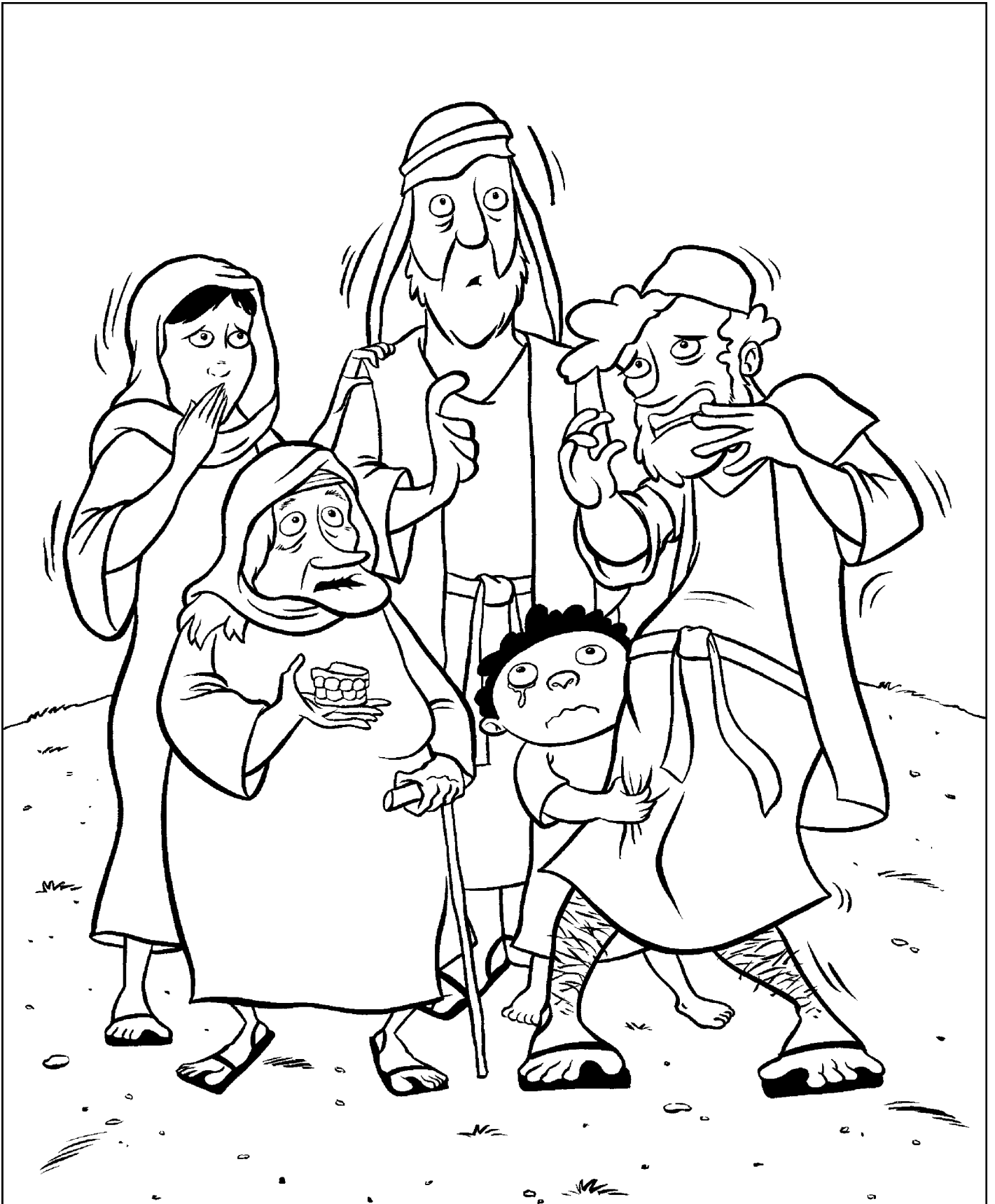
**“And the LORD said to Moses, ‘Behold, I come to you in the thick cloud, that the people may hear when I speak with you, and believe you forever’”
(Exodus 19:9).**



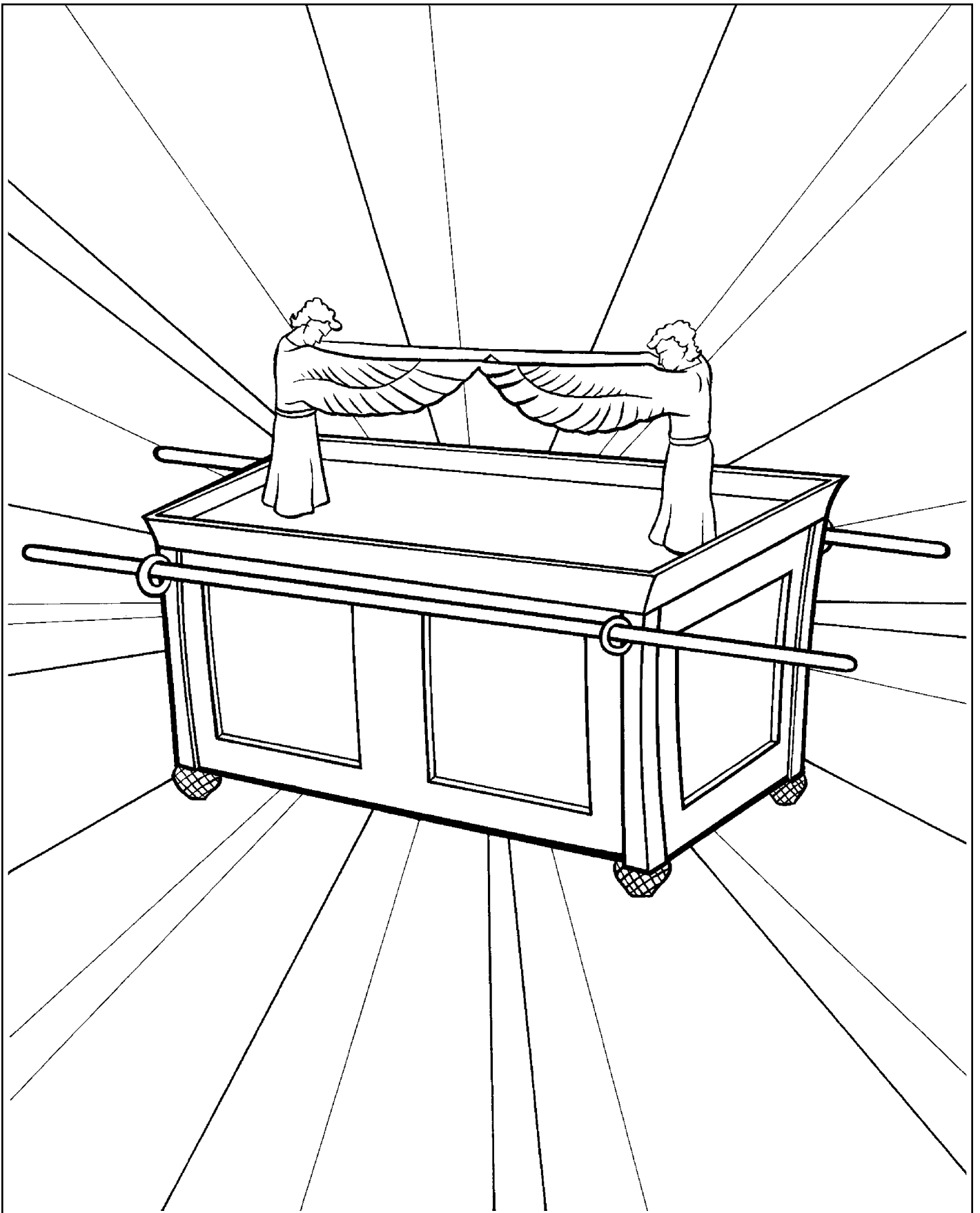

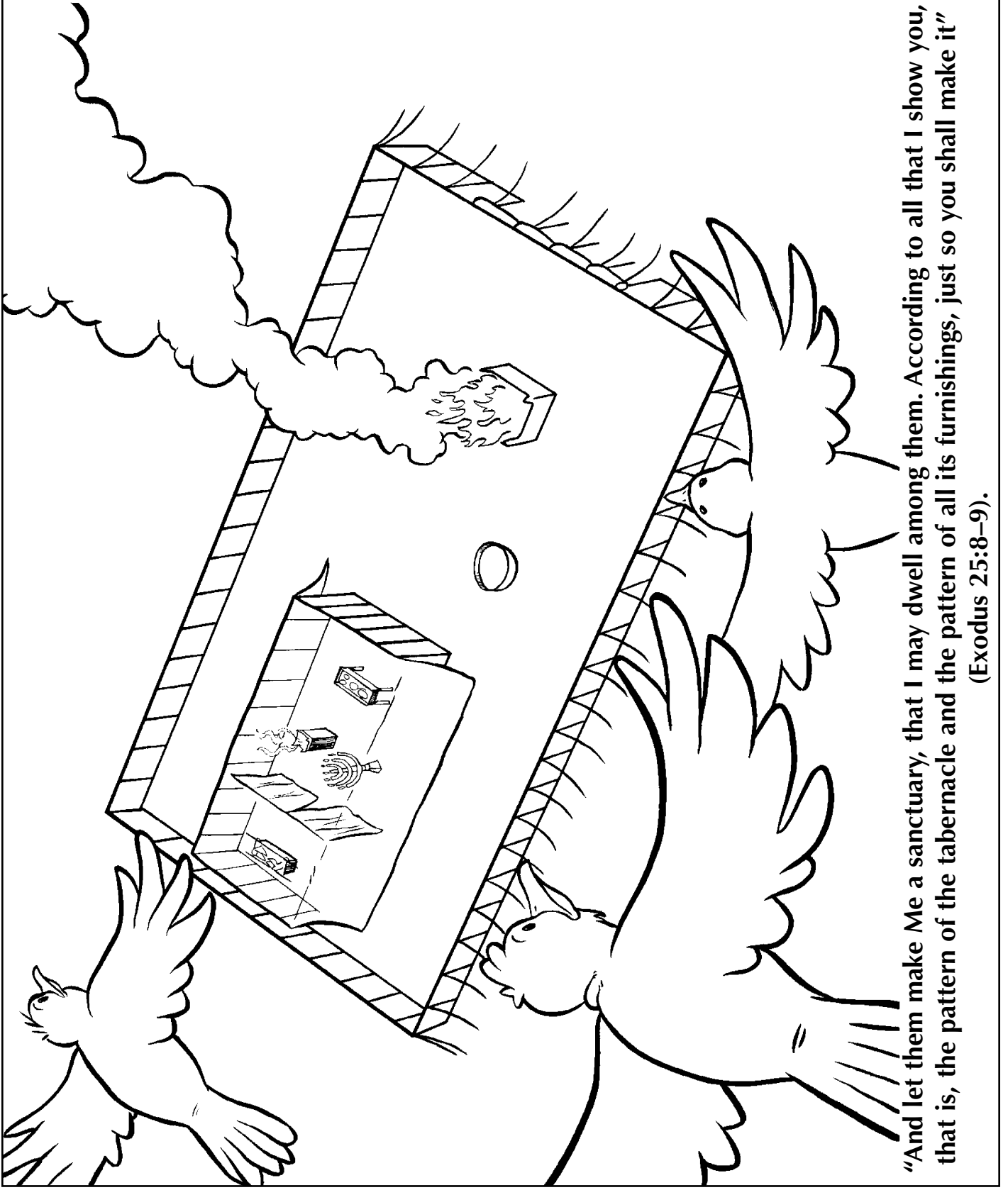
Moses received the commandments from God in the midst of the cloud of God's glory (Exodus 24:12-18).

(Exodus 25:8-9).**



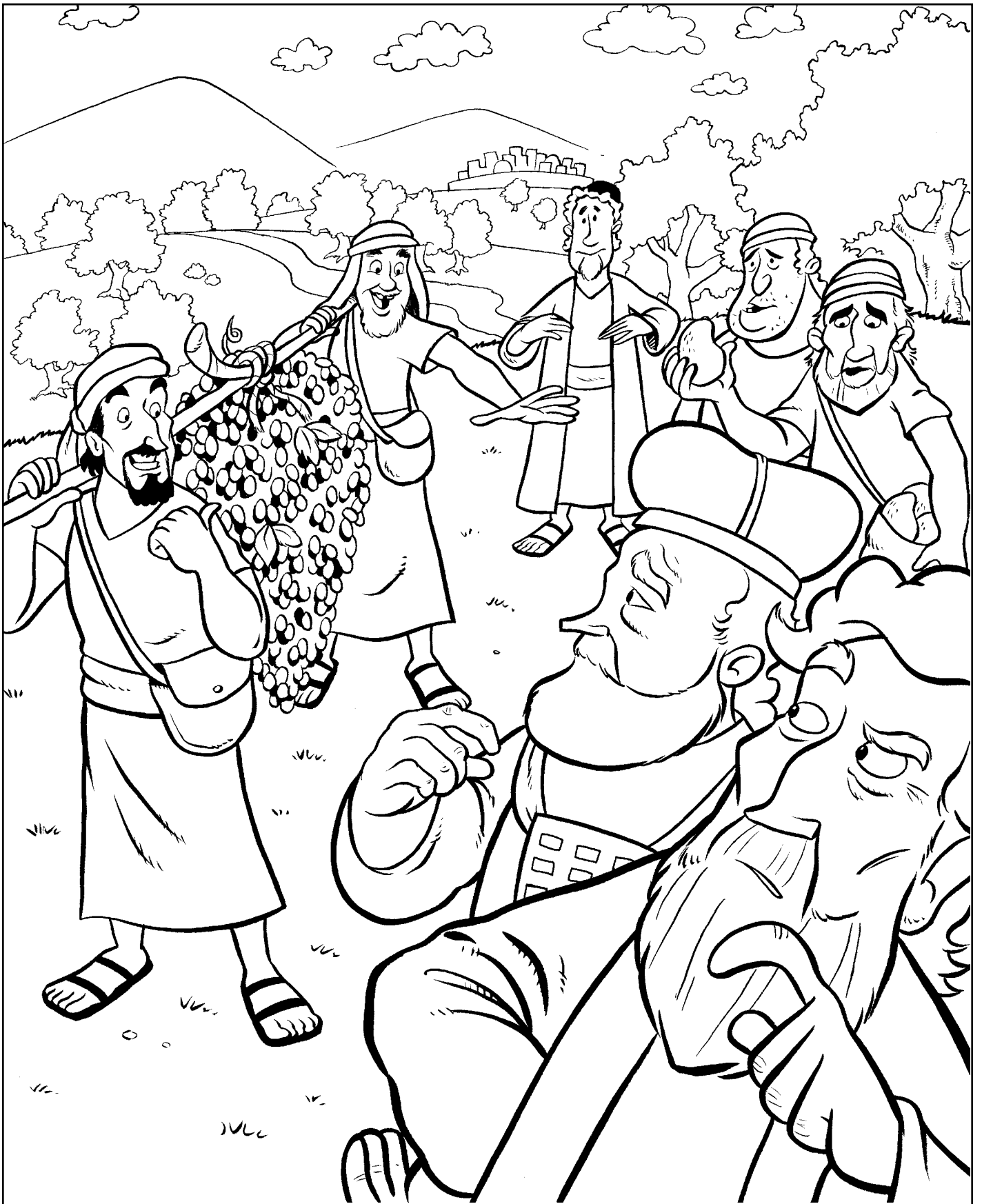
“Then the cloud covered the tabernacle of meeting, and the glory of the LORD filled the tabernacle” (Exodus 40:34).

and with all your strength” (Deuteronomy 6:5).**



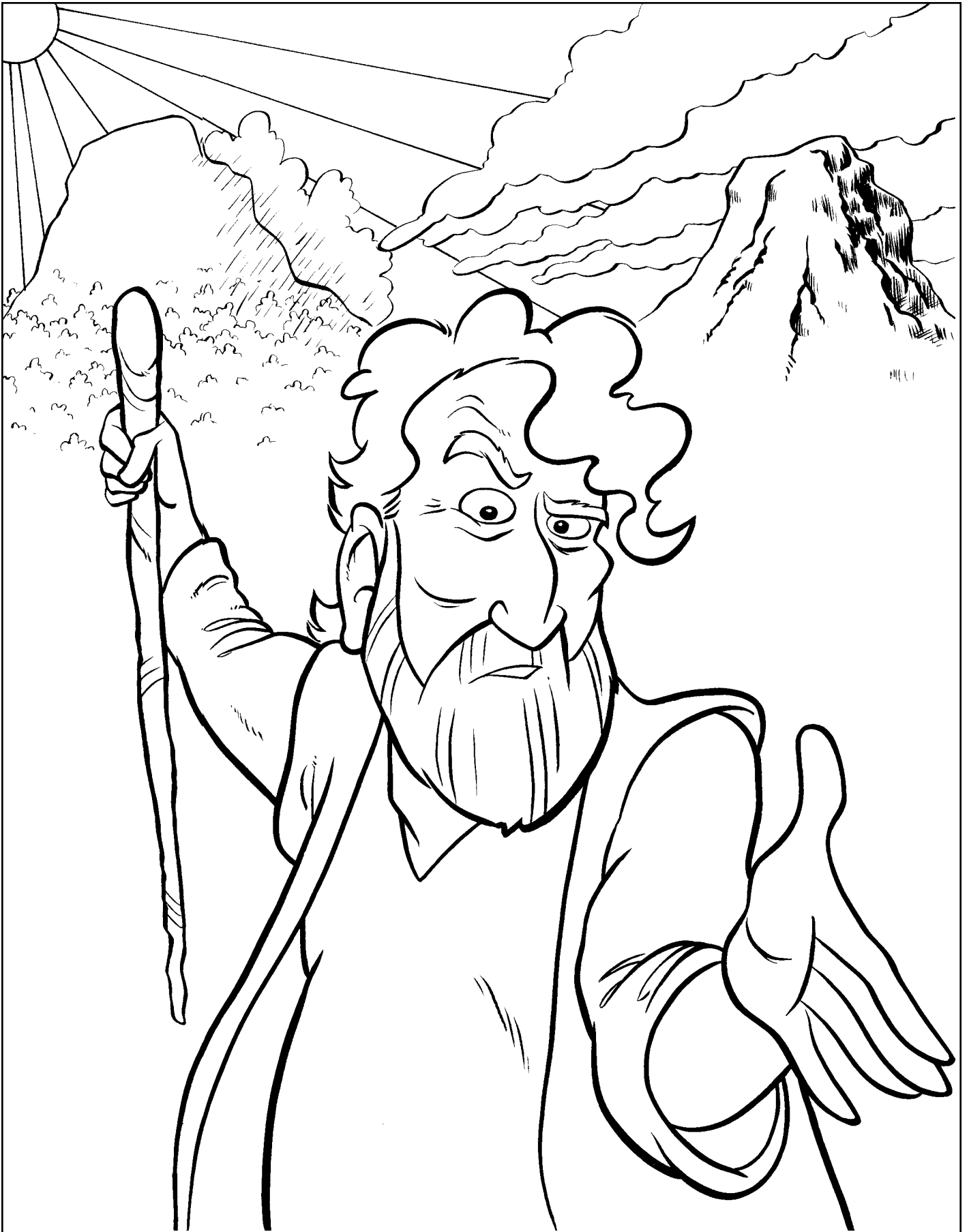
**The Israelites were called to daily teach God's Word to their children

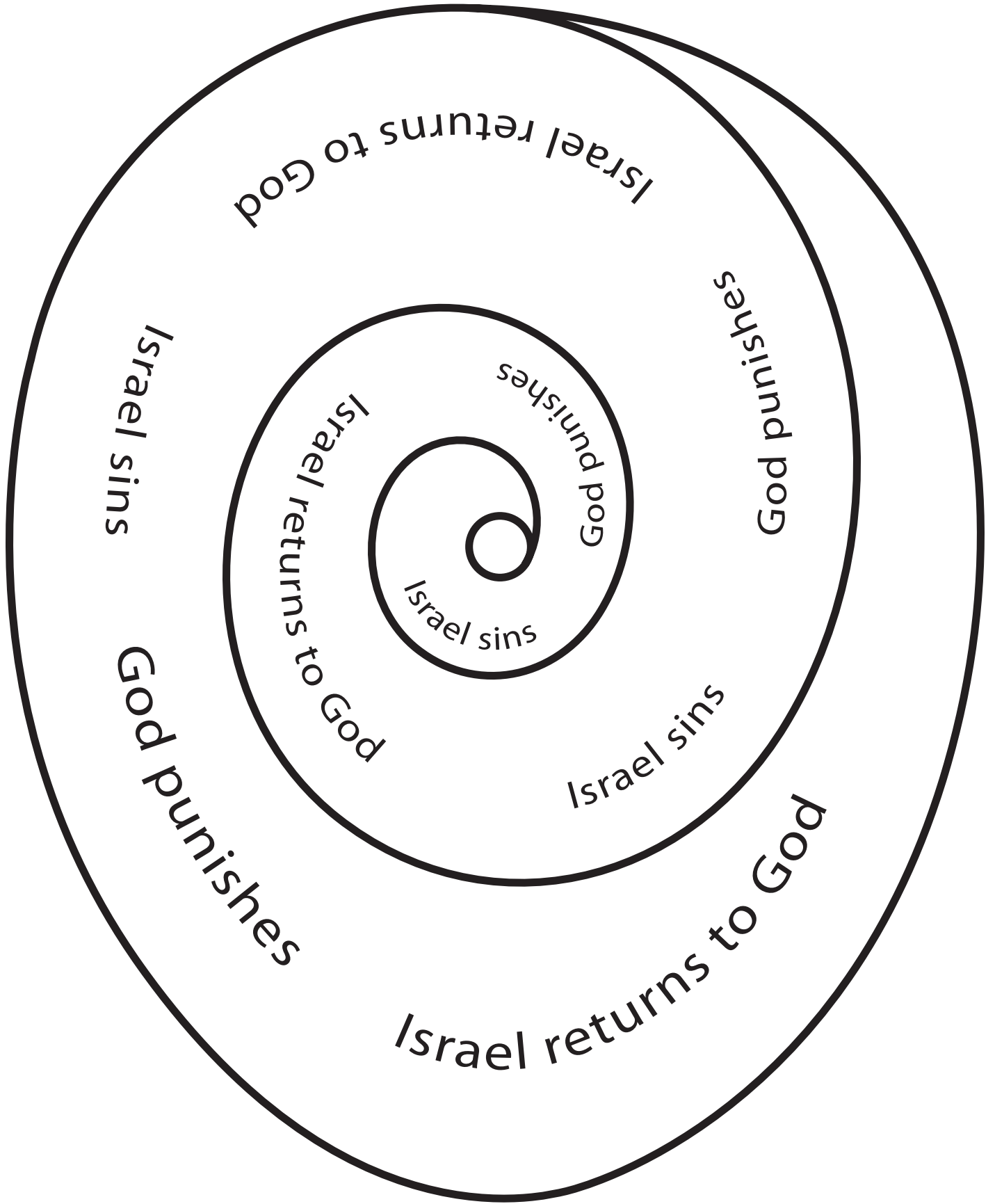
